- Is Council comfortable with staff's operational plan for special event enforcement?
 - Code Enforcement
 - Special Conditions Enforcement

- Ensure public safety of residents and visitors
- Support the economics of the community
- 80+% cost recovery for the city
- Support high quality event planning
- Facilitate/support fun event experiences
- Minimize community impacts from special events

Police Department provides regular code enforcement

- Parking
- Disorderly conduct
- Liquor Law Licensed Premises Boundaries
- Waste Management/Wildlife Container Compliance
- Public Safety Calls for Service

Conditions which, if not met, can cause impacts:

- # of portable toilets
- Trash/Recycling/Waste Management
- Parking
- Signage
- Security
- Liquor boundaries

2021 Special Event Condition Enforcement

- After action meetings with staff and event producers

Proposed 2022 Special Event Condition Enforcement

- Events with a history of non-compliance with event conditions
 - Notification of Inspection
 - Inspection (random combination of pre, during, post event)
- All Events
 - After action meetings with staff and event producers

Events targeted for inspection in 2022

- Lacrosse Tournament (parking, portable toilets)
- Free Concert Series (trash, security, portable toilets, liquor boundary)
- Soccer Tournament (parking-Whistler Park)
- SBT GRVL (trash, parking at Howelsen)
- Art in the Park (liquor boundary, Lincoln closure, signage)
- Triple Crown (parking plan)
- Fall Festival (trash)
- Farmers Market (portable toilets)

Special Event Compliance Options

1. Compliance Plans
2. Non-renewal for violation of conditions and life/safety issues
3. Limited days and/or hours
4. Restricted locations
5. Fines
6. Fees
7. Security Deposits

- Continue code enforcement.
- Warn and inspect events that have not complied with conditions in previous years.
- Provide post event warnings and compliance plans for events that do not comply with event conditions in 2022.
- Charge damage fees for events that require City staff time and materials to be repair any damages to the event venue. This fee would be charged after the event.
- Deny permits for events that continue to violate conditions of approval after 2 years and are identified as a life/safety risk by public safety. (see Attachment 5)
